Sustainable Development Goals

Vienna's Past Holds a Key to How We Approach Today's Global Challenges

Some say Vienna is beholden to her past, but the city also sees in its past a path toward the future. We know from history that Vienna has overcome major challenges, many similar to those our interconnected world faces today: lack of clean water and sanitation, inadequate housing, plague and epidemics. The forward thinking, innovation and perseverance exhibited then may give us – and future generations – the hope we need in our fast-moving times.

In 2015, the member countries of the United Nations adopted the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. These aim to improve the lives of people around the world through education, health care, clean water and sustainable cities. Vienna is both a strong supporter of these UN goals and in many ways a trailblazer in showing how these goals can be achieved.

Let's take a walk back in time to see how people in the Middle Ages coped with a lack of sanitation and clean water among the narrow streets of the old city. What innovations pioneered by the Romans were revived in the 19th century to provide Vienna with the pure water it is known for today? What was revolutionary about the concepts of "Red Vienna"? Who were the drivers behind measures to stem the spread of disease in the 17th and 18th centuries? What can an eagle on the Graben teach us about conserving wildlife? Seeing how challenges were overcome in the past may give us hope for achieving the sustainable development goals that aim to provide a liveable planet for our children, and theirs, in the future.

Artworks at the UN in Vienna

Are you an art lover wishing to discover and enjoy the fine collection of artworks from around the world that is housed at the Vienna International Centre (VIC)?

The UN Vienna art collection was started by Austria, the host country, as a representation of Austrian contemporary art trends at the time of the VIC's opening, back in 1979. Since then many other Member States have added their own contributions to the collection, creating a unique mix of artistic styles, forms of expressions and cultural traditions. The pieces coexist in an environment as diverse as the art itself.

The collection includes works by Austrian modern masters such as Rudolf Hausner, Alfred Hrdlicka, Martha Jungwirth, Friedensreich Hundertwasser, Hermann Nitsch, Marcus Prachensky, Max Weiler and many more. Other highlights include a beautiful depiction of the "Ho-o Raigi" sacred birds by Japanese artist Sagenji Yoshida; a Scholar's Pavilion built as a "Chartaghi", a typical characteristic of Iranian architecture; and a Mongolian "Gerege" used as a diplomatic passport in the times of Genghis Khan.
